## Hussion named new principal at Union County High

Starting the 2017-2018 school year, C.T. Hussion will be the new principal at Union County High School.

Hussion was promoted from his current position of assistant principal to principal by the Union County Board of Education in a called board meeting on Wednesday, May

The decision to place Hussion at the helm of the high school came after the position opened up for the next school year, following the appointment of current UCHŜ Principal John Hill to the board office.

Moving forward, Hill will be serving as director of human resources and operations for the system, and he has already begun the job.

According to Union County Schools Superintendent Dr. Fred Rayfield, Hussion was one of three internal candidates considered for the high school principal position by the board and School Governance

"Knowing that Mr. Hill moved to the central office position and was approved in that position not too long ago, we immediately advertised our high school principal position internally," said Dr. Rayfield to the board on Wednesday.

Continued Dr. Rayfield: "We did that because we felt like we had a really good pool

of internal applicants, and that did not disappoint us. We had three very good applicants, and after the deadline had passed, as per your charter, the Governance Team at the high school met and considered those three applications."

Dr. Rayfield said that the recommendation of the Governance Team aligned with his personal recommendation to hire C.T. Hussion for the

"He's been a very successful assistant principal under Mr. Hill, he's very familiar with the high school,' said Dr. Rayfield. "He was named the state Assistant High School Principal of the Year this past year.

"He's done an outstanding job, and I have every confidence, as does the Governance Team, the students and the faculty and staff have every confidence in Mr. Hussion, that he will continue to take the high school forward to the next level."

The board voted unanimously to accept the recommendation of Hussion as upcoming high school principal, and the meeting promptly closed.

Hussion taught at the

high school for seven years and coached for much of his time as a teacher before moving up to the administrative level.

He has been assistant principal for four years, and he looks forward to the challenges ahead as principal of the high "We're one of the best

high schools in Northeast Georgia, and that's not something to be taken lightly," said Hussion following the meeting. "It's a big job. You've got 850 kids, you've got their families, you've got almost 100 employees in the building.

"So, this is something that is a great honor, it's something that I'm excited about. It's been a goal of mine as I move up through administration. I've got children in the middle school and elementary school coming up through, and so it's exciting. It's a family environment, so I'm happy to be able to continue at the school in a higher leadership capacity."

The high school has experienced an increased graduation rate and greater test scores over the past four years that Hill and Hussion have been administrators there, and Hussion looks forward to picking up the torch of leadership at UCHS.

"John and I have worked really good as a team," said Hussion. "I'll miss him, but I'm proud of him going to the board, because I know he's going to do a great job in his

Continued Hussion: "We all have the same vision, and that's of excellence and employability, and creating opportunities for all students.

Hill attended the meeting where his friend and colleague was hired to fill his shoes at the high school.

"I could not be happier with the choice that the school system has made for the high school principal, to be my successor, and I feel very confident in his ability to take our school to the next level of success," said Hill. "Getting to the top is the easy part, and he's about to have the hard part, staying on top. And he's the man for the job."


