That's why the chamber teamed up with North Georgia Technical College to provide thousands of pairs of special eclipse-viewing glasses to the public, for \$2 apiece, that will make looking at the eclipse safe during its partial phases.

To be clear, looking directly at the sun is never safe, even with sunglasses on, and the same holds true for the majority of the phases of the eclipse. It is only during totality, when the moon completely blocks out the sun, that it is safe to view the eclipse with the naked eye.

For Blairsville, that

Representatives with the Union County Sheriff's Office, Union General Hospital and EMS, Union County Fire Department, Union County EMA, Union County Government, Georgia Department of Natural Resources, the U.S. Forest Service and other first responders attended the meeting.

Many of those representatives said they are looking into boosting first responder presence during the eclipse, and the school system is considering options of early release or just not having school that day, with an eye toward eclipse traffic, though that decision will be up to the Union County Board of Education.

As for what's actually happening during a solar eclipse, the moon is moving directly between the sun and earth, causing a 70-mile wide shadow of the moon to travel upon the planet's surface.

Eclipse-viewing glasses are available for \$2 at chamber headquarters in the Union County Community Center, where residents will also be able to purchase Blairsville Eclipse Éxperience T-shirts.

EMA Director Dyer said he plans to hold another eclipse safety meeting with county and regional first responders in the near future, as the eclipse is a mere month and a half away.
