Sanchez and Underwood lead Union Cross Country into State Meet

Robertstown - Union County Cross County may have joined one of the most difficult regions in the state but history still repeated itself as both squads are returning to Carrollton for the State Meet on Saturday morning.

In a region that has seen four different teams (including Union) in both the boys and girls Class AAA top-10 during the course of the year, the Region 7-AAA Championships, held at Unicoi State Park, were dominated by those four schools.

Dawson County, North Hall, Union County, and Greater Atlanta Christian took home all four trophies and 13-of-14 individual medals.

The 7-AAA girls race was held first and freshman Zoe Sanchez immediately found herself in the top-10, less than a half-mile into the race.

As she neared the onemile mark, Sanchez moved into sixth place and that's where she stayed for the remainder of the race.

"It was a bit scary at first but once I got into my steady I was pretty good," Sanchez said. "I knew I could have done better once I started into my steady but I didn't get enough momentum to go faster."

She would cross the finish line sixth with a time of 20:43, nearly 40 seconds better than seventh place, and four seconds back of fifth place.

Despite losing its No. 2 runner to injury in September, Union still managed to place four girls in the top 25 and come in third place overall - punching their ticket to State.

When asked what goals she has in mind for her very first State Meet in Carrollton, Sanchez answered with one simple goal.

"Not die." she said with a laugh.

On the boys side, Union County was led by a runner with tons of Region and State experience, junior Lance Underwood.

And despite battling a hamstring injury earlier in the week, he still managed to pull off a top-five finish and lead his team to fourth overall.



Individually, Union County freshman Lexie Ochoa took home 17th with a time of 23:07.

Freshman Sadie Underwood was 19th at 23:58, and another 9th grader, Allison Vincent was 24th and crossed the finish line in 24:44.

Sophomore Destiny Orellana came in 26th with a time of 24:51, senior Kaitlyn Gallagher placed 27th at 24:59, and freshman Jessie Holbrook was 34th with a time of 26:22.

Union County Head Cross Country Coach Paige Dyer now becomes the first coach not named Jackie Hughes to take UCHS Cross Country to State.

As for the State Meet, it will be held on Saturday at Carrollton High School. Unfortunately, Class AAA will get underway bright and early on Saturday morning with the girls race beginning at 8 a.m.

The boys race will follow at 8:45 a.m. Should any Union County teams or individuals place, the awards ceremony will be held across the street from the course at the Carrollton High School baseball field.

"This year my goals for the State Meet are probably going to be a little bit different since we jumped to (Class AAA), but I still hope to finish in the top 15," Underwood said.


Lynch is also four yards away from setting a new career high in rushing yards - surpassing his total of 746 last season.
