UCHS' Krieger named Systemwide Teacher of the Year

It was award time for Union County's top teachers at last week's Union County Board of Education meeting.

Carla Drake, of Union County Primary School, Keri Young of Union County Elementary School, Debbie Wilson of Union County Middle School, Glenn Kough of Woody Gap School, and April Krieger of Union County High School, were voted by their peers as the 2014 Teachers of the Year.

Union mary School Principal Millie Owenby said Drake, a 16-year veteran teacher, has covered the gambit in teaching, working at all levels of education. "When I think of her, the word that describes her is

patience," Owenby said. Union County Elementary School Principal Patri-

cia Cook told the crowd that Young was a dedicated educa-

"This is Keri's first year teaching at the elementary school," Cook said. "She came over from Woody Gap and I think it's remarkable

that a teacher who hasn't even been here a full year yet has been chosen by the faculty to be Teacher of the Year.

"Her work is awesome

and she deserves Teacher of the Year," Cook said. "She treats students with respect and makes them feel like kings and queens in her class-

Union County Middle School Principal Gwen Stone said Wilson was at the school early and went home late. "You will find her early

in the morning with students, at lunch with students and after school with students," Stone said. "She provides her students everything that she

"By far, my word for her is dedication," Stone said. "She's not only dedicated to her current students, but she's always checking on students she has taught in the past."

UCHS Principal John Hill said it's hard to find a teacher as dedicated as Krieger.

"The biggest problem I have with April Krieger is that sometimes it's 7,8 or sometimes 9 o'clock at night and I have to go to her classroom and tell her it's time to go home," Hill said. "But, this is an example of how good of a teacher she is.

'When I'm in her classroom, she engages everyone,' he said. "She teaches the strug-

gling learners, and she teaches to the brightest students we have. She is so well deserving of this award as Teacher of the

Woody Gap School Coprincipal Sheila Collins stood before the crowd with a plaque and no teacher.

It seems that Glenn

Kough was on the sidelines of the tennis court coaching his Boys' to a victory over Towns County. 'Glenn's been in Woody

Gap a long time, and we're glad he's been a part of the program," Collins said. "We're proud that Glenn won this honor, and we're sad that he's not here." Once each Teacher of the Year was introduced by

In 95 years, Ira Harkins has been around the world and back again. The U.S. Army Veteran

was drafted into service in 1942 after the United States entered World War II. From there he served

31 years before retiring as a Sergeant Major in 1973, after seeing combat during the Vietnam War. On Friday, the Union

County Historical Society hosted a birthday celebration for the local hero at the Historic Downtown Courthouse. When asked the secret

to staying healthy and happy for almost 100 years, his answer was simple and there is nothing secretive about it. Harkins was blessed

"Because of Derrick's love of children and his community, the Memorial Fund was established in 2012 to support and encourage Union County High School seniors with scholarship money," Whittle's mother, Sharon Whittle said. "To date, six seniors have been awarded scholarships to assist with their college education.'

Derrick Whittle sustained life-threatening injuries in a Sept. 15, 2011 on-duty

Three days after the crash Deputy Whittle succumbed to his injuries. He died at Erlanger Hospital in Chattanooga, Tenn.

Deputy Whittle was responding to a domestic dispute with weapons involved on Sept. 15, 2011.

Enotah Circuit District Attorney Jeff Langley remembers Whittle well.

"Deputy Whittle was responding to a domestic disturbance involving weapons when his patrol car left the roadway and struck a tree near the intersection of Mt. Pleasant Church Road and Bowers Circle," he said. "Deputy Whittle was responding to a threat in his community.

Deputy Whittle was transported to Union General Hospital that afternoon before

Hill sentenced to 24 months in federal prison

Gainesville - Charles Elliott Hill II, 48, of Blairsville has been sentenced to serve 24 months in federal prison for concealment of assets in U.S. Bankruptcy Court, according to federal documents obtained by the *North Georgia News*.

Hill pled guilty in U.S. District Court for the Northern District of Georgia in Gainesville on Feb. 27, U.S. District Court records show. According to the fed-

eral court documents, Hill concealed \$183,000 in assets when he filed bankruptcy in U.S. Bankruptcy Court in Gainesville. In addition to the

24 months to serve in federal prison, Hill must pay

tence is complete, Hill must serve three years on federal probation, pay a \$1,000 fine, and serve 200 hours of community service, federal court Hill must report by
