District 4-H Shotgun meet on Saturday; county closes on 4-H property

Union County has purchased 9.502 acres to construct a Shotgun Park.

Sole Commissioner Lamar Paris made the announcement at the County Meeting last week at the Union County

The purchase price of the property is \$150,000. The county's part is \$135,000. The county paid the entire \$150,000 and will be reimbursed \$5,000 a year over the next three years by Union County 4-H, Paris

The property, on the north side of Georgia 515, near Queens Gap becomes the home turf for the Union County 4-H Shotgun, BB Gun, and Archery teams.

The home turf advantage brings a welcomed relief to the teams who have been forced to

move locations, being spread out like buckshot across the county during 17 prosperous years of shooting.

News of the property

closing comes a little late for Union County 4-H as they prepare to host the District Shotgun Meet on Saturday.

There's no way site prep-

aration could be completed in time for the annual District

Instead, the meet will be held at Airport Industrial Park

on Airport Industrial Drive off Georgia 515, west of Blairsville. Turn right on Thomas Farm Road and look for the Team Coach Gene Margelli

Concessions will be available throughout the day, Margelli said.

'We plan to shoot, rain or shine," Margelli said. "Obviously, if a downpour or thunder and lightning situation arises, the shoot will be postponed or canceled as necessary.'

For the past three years, Margelli and fellow coach Keith Herbert actively looked for a location to call home for the Shotgun Team. They came to Paris for help.

'This has been our biggest challenge as an organization," Margelli said. "We feel we found the right piece of property that would benefit all the 4-H teams we mentioned plus allow local residents the opportunity to enjoy the same

State: 'cause of Fox's death, undetermined'

The March 1 death of 54-year-old Jeff Fox has been ruled an undetermined death, according to the state Medical Examiner's Office.

Initially, the state Medical Examiner's Office ruled that Fox's death was a homi-

They had to back track on that, as further testing of evidence proved inconclusive, Union County Chief Deputy John George said. "The biggest puzzle

in this case, the doors to the home were locked from the inside," Chief Deputy George said. "We talked with numerous individuals, we conducted polygraph tests, there simply was no evidence to indicate foul play once all avenues of investigation were exhausted in this case.

"We eliminated all the factors and the cause of death was inconclusive," Chief Deputy George said.

Fox suffered from underlying medical conditions that could have contributed to his death, according to the Medical Examiner's Office.

Patriots brave the elements on a special day

Those underlying medi-

cal conditions include a seizure disorder, according to the Med-

ical Examiner's Office. "Is it possible that he suffered a seizure? That's a possibility," Union County Detective Sgt. Andrew Hammond said. "However, there is no medical test that can conclude that a person died of a seizure-related event. There's just no possible way to determine if a person was involved in a seizure after

On scene, the day of Fox's death inside his Brown Ridge Road home, the Georgia Bureau of Investigation felt like the case was a homicide, Sgt. Hammond said.

"It was definitely a suspicious death the day the body was taken to the State Crime Laboratory," Sgt. Hammond said. "(GBI) later determined the death was undetermined. An extensive review of the
