Augusta - The Union County Lady Panthers golf team put an exclamation point on its 2014 season by placing in a tie for seventh at the Class AA State Tournament at Pointe South Golf Course in

Sixty-six girls teed it up last week along with Union's four representatives who were being led by Maddie Horinek. The freshman paced the Lady Panthers with an 89, good enough for an 11th place individual finish in the State. Behind Horinek for

Union was Kacie Godwin who shot a 100 and finished in a tie for 30th. Lydia Gray finished 46th with a 112, and Autumn Johnson placed tied for 57th with a 141.


Team-wise, Horinek and Godwin combined for a 189, thirty-five strokes behind State Champion Vidalia, who were almost 20 strokes better than the rest of the field. The Lady Panthers, who

tied with Lovett, finished two strokes back of sixth place and Region 8-AA rival Rabun County. Union and Lovett were two shots better than ninth place Bremen and five strokes ahead of 10th place St. Vincent's Academy.






