ter than ever.

“Due to community support, we were able to increase the size of the show by about 20 percent, and that would be on the conservative side,” said Joey Swanson, chairman of the Chamber Board of Directors.

By bigger, Swanson said he means that the show will feature more “boom booms” and will be “brighter, more spectacular, more robust,” but will last about the same length of time as last year’s show.

Swanson and the rest of the chamber board have been hard at work selling \$10 raffle tickets that directly support the fireworks show. These tickets have been available at the chamber office and at the various businesses of chamber members around the community.

Residents can still take part in the raffle, all the way up to the evening of July 4 at Meeks Park, and the winner of the raffle, which will be drawn at the end of the show, will win \$1,000.



All proceeds from the ticket sales go toward supporting the fireworks show, so residents who choose to purchase a raffle ticket are not only getting the chance to win money, but they are supporting a community endeavor for all to enjoy.

“Last year was the first year we’d broken even on the show, so this year we decided to increase the show, increase the cost, but still are looking for community support, and to thank

the community for making it possible,” said Swanson.

Added Swanson: “It’s through donations from our sponsors and the folks that buy the VIP parking spots, and the people that buy the individual raffle tickets that

make the show possible.”

Swanson would like to thank several businesses and entities that helped to make this year’s show possible: WoodmenLife, Budget Blinds, the Chamber Board, Chamber Ambassadors and Chamber Staff.

“We will be selling raffle tickets at the Union County Farmers Market on Saturday before the 4th,” said Swanson. “We’ll have a pretty large presence of folks there selling tickets, so if you want to buy your ticket early to get in on the raffle, then you’ll have the opportunity at the Farmers Market on Saturday morning.”

For those who live in or live closer to Suches, the Suches Fire Department will be hosting its annual fireworks shows after 9 p.m. on Monday, July 4.

The adjustment is based on the state and local base salary scale. It will appear on the October paycheck and will be a one-time adjustment for employees.
