

Union County 12&U softball places second; 10&U third at State Tourney

Cartersville - Two Union County youth all-star softball teams reached the final day of their respective state tournaments over the weekend with the 12&U softball team placing second - two wins short, and the 10&U girls coming up three wins shy of a state title.

The Lady Panthers 12&U team reached the finals of the Dizzy Dean State Tournament but were unable to come away with a victory over the host team, Bartow Blue.

Union County defeated Bartow White in the opening round before scoring a victory over Barrow County, who received a bye into the second round.

In the third round, the Lady Panthers fell to Bartow Blue for the first time, who had also received a bye.

Bartow Blue was granted a free pass into the third round after knocking off Gordon County in round one.

The loss forced Union into the losers bracket on Sunday morning where they took care of Bartow White in a rematch at 10:45 a.m.

The Lady Panthers were victorious over Villa Rica at 12:30 p.m. to earn another shot at Bartow Blue in the finals, scheduled for 2:15 p.m.

Following a rain delay of nearly three hours, Bartow came out on top 2-0 to take the State Championship.

The Lady Panthers 10&U softball team was one game away from reaching the finals but fell to Douglas.

Following wins over Gordon County (10-3) and Bremen (14-4), Union met Barrow County, the eventual State Champion and fell 9-6.

After the loss to Barrow at 9 a.m. Sunday, the Lady Panthers were forced to play a doubleheader, where they were upended by Douglas, 9-3.
