A. The county is building a convenience center there.

### Q. What is a Convenience Center?

A. It will be a location where the public will be able to bring their bagged trash and recyclables only. The cost per bag and the manned hours of operation will be the same as at the Transfer Station near the hospital. No commercial garbage or loose garbage will be allowed. It is to provide a safe and very clean area to provide the public an alternative for traveling to town.

### Q. When will the Convenience Center at the intersection of Highway 325 and Highway 515 be open?

A. I am hopeful that it will be open in the next 60 days. We still have to install security cameras, fence the area, pave the road, and install equipment. The new compactor was taken to the site to

prepare to have it hooked up. Believe it or not, while it was sitting there, people started taking their personal garbage and dumping it in the compactor. We even had to take a lawn mower out of the mechanism that someone dumped there. It is very disappointing what some people will do. That is why we have just added security camera hookups to our list. We will not tolerate this site being anything short of pristine. This site will be operated and manned by Advanced Disposal.

### Q. Where do I go to get a Marriage License?

A. You would need to go to the Probate Judge's Office where they keep the Vital Records. They also handle various other things such as birth and death certificates, conceal carry permits, and traffic tickets. Their office is located here in the Courthouse.
