

Union Co. football returns with Friday scrimmage

The conclusion of the 2014 football season was a bitter pill to swallow for Union County football, but the Panthers will be back on the field this Friday when they host Holy Innocents Episcopal School in a scrimmage contest.

Full-contact practice with pads began on Monday for Union County, and the week will conclude with the chance to hit someone other than a fellow teammate.

When asked what Panther fans can expect on Friday night, Union County Head Coach Brian Allison made it clear that it will be a very controlled scrimmage.

"We want to put 11 players out there on the field and see how it goes," Coach Allison said. "We've got some time before we play a game that counts, and since we didn't have spring practice, we just want to see where we're at and make corrections."

According to Georgia High School Association rules, by not holding spring practice, the Panthers were allowed to add another preseason scrimmage.

"We're going to be very careful (to avoid injury) and keep the play calling pretty basic on both sides of the ball," Allison added.

Despite going into the game with only four days of practice, one area Coach Allison isn't concerned about is the quarterback position.

Union County returns a First Team All-State selection in senior Joseph Mancuso. Although, the Panthers' field general will be throwing to some new targets this year after three of Union's top four pass catchers graduated.

However, the lone returning starter at the receiver position is a good one.

Senior Sam Gilbert was named First Team All-Region as a junior after hauling in 45 catches for 732 yards, and 8 scores - third most on the team in all three categories.

After Gilbert, the only returning receivers that caught

a pass in 2014 are senior Knox line and an experienced second-Kiernan and sophomore Austin ary are expected to provide the Pattee - each caught one pass last year.

Luckily, Gilbert won't be asked to do it all thanks to the development of a converted quarterback, sophomore wide out Cole Wright.

"He (Wright) has had a great summer and we're really excited about him," Coach Allison said. "We've got Gilbert back and Knox Kiernan has done a nice job."

The Panthers offensive line and running game have improved and that should also take some of the pressure off of Mancuso.

about the offensive and defensive lines," Coach Allison said. "At running back, Bo (Lynch) will be the starter, but we've got some guys like Nick Rodriguez and Cole Dockrey that we also feel comfortable with."

Scoring points hasn't been a problem for the Panthers, but keeping the other team out of the endzone was an issue late in the year.

At the conclusion of last season, Coach Allison made it clear that the defense is one area that would be addressed during the offseason.
