Garcia led the Panthers with a time of 19:29, placing 56th overall. Kelley was 72nd at 19:56, Jakob Brown finished 101st at 20:51, Andrew Nelson was 106th with a time of 21:05, Jeremy Herum placed 109th at 21:12, while Ryan Rogers finished at 21:14 and Aaron Stafford checked in at 21:55.

The Lady Panther sophomore finished with a time of 19:50, more than 44 seconds ahead of North Hall's Makayla

She also bested last year's Class AAA State Champion, Kaitlyn Gearing from White County by more than two minutes.

Union County hasn't played a home game since






